#### From the Grand Master ...

Our Role as a Past Master: We are naturally proud to have served as Master of a Lodge. A fact which further brings home the responsibilities a member owes to the Craft as a whole and to his Lodge in particular. As a Past Master, we must set the example, especially in the area of the Mechanics of the Work and our Ritual. If we fail to set the example, why should you expect Lodge Officers to do any better? Everything you do and say should be the best possible example of the way the ritual must be done. When you set the example, you help facilitate the results our Work demands. Setting the proper example is one way members will learn to be better officers on their journey towards the East. While a very simple competency on the face of it, none is more important. Setting an example is one way Past Masters can influence the progress of Freemasonry in his Lodge. It will be difficult to achieve this goal, if you don't have a current copy of the Book of the Work and the Ceremony of Installation & Investiture booklet.

Returns and Payments to Grand Lodge – D.D.G.M. Duties: By now, all lodges should have sent in their returns and payments to Grand Lodge. They were due on or before January 8, 2014. The D.D.G.M. must be aware of section 97 of the Constitution of Grand Lodge: "The D.D.G.M. shall visit all the lodges in his District during his term of office, and shall see that they are working in the authorized manner, and that returns have been regularly forwarded to Grand Lodge, together with all moneys owing to it. Should any lodge refuse or neglect to make that required returns and payments he shall immediately report the fact in writing to the Grand Master."

Brethren, like it or not, we are in an age of electronic communications. In today's social media networking, we need to use all available mediums to communicate with our members. The task of the Communications Committee and the Editor of the on line Ontario Mason is to bring you up to date with the new age of electronic communications.

Cast your minds back to the mid 1990's and just think for a moment, how many members of your lodge were using computers or, indeed, if the lodge secretary even possessed a computer! How dramatically different it is today.
