While there is no substitute for choosing the right leaders to begin with, leaders can become more successful through the development of a sound leadership development strategy. Strategy starts with understanding what is important for the lodge and where the gaps are. With the right understanding of needs and support from the top, a leadership development model, that works, can be developed. It has been said in order to have sound management, one must first have control of time and a solid plan is the tool to tighten that control. Timing is a vital part of planning any lodge meeting and is instrumental in achieving one major goal, that of sending everyone home at a reasonable hour, satisfied that the evening was filled with propriety, dignity, perhaps a little humour, and lots of good fellowship. From the Deputy Grand Master

We have been very busy in recent weeks at a number of Masonic activities from Eastern district to St. Thomas district.

Brethren, as you know we spend a lot of time developing and presenting Grand Lodge programs and it recently came to my attention, from Lodge Resources and the Condition of Masonry, there are situations in some areas of our Grand Jurisdiction, where the programs are not being used. In fact, one very enlightening matter was some are being totally ignored. For example, the Brother to Brother program that has a large volume of examples that will assist us in the operation of lodges but we find that 75-80% of lodges are not using it. This particular program contains examples of significant presentations, how to consider a Rusty Mason Night, Friend to Friend events and many samples of information can be useful to any lodge with a variety of items that are educational and informative to our membership.

I know that some of our programs require a lodge to look at itself and come to conclusions that are difficult to admit. There are situations in our lodges that could be improved. If we can get to the point of admission some of our challenges could be addressed with a different approach.

Long Range Planning is one area that becomes a challenge to many lodges. There are those who can provide information that might correct or help provide assistance to your lodge and their membership. If you have recognized challenges, that are distracting to the operation of your lodge, perhaps consider contacting STEVEN WARREN or BILL BOWICK and their respective committees [Long Range Planning and Leadership

Development] and share your concerns to see if they might help. LODGE RESOURCES COMMITTEE which includes such programs as BROTHER to BROTHER, MENTOR, FRIEND to FRIEND, OFFICER PROGRESSION and CORNERSTONE can be of a guide and assistance in almost any lodge. The individuals who serve on these committees have committed their Masonic activity to improves FREEMASONRY in general. We should take advantage of their expertise and generosity of time and effort. Programs only work when used.

Brethren, the **Holiday Season** is upon us and we should at this time of year, in particular, think of those less fortunate for variety of reasons. In our life's experience there are circumstances that challenge, and a great many in our society would greatly appreciate company and compassion during difficult times. My final thoughts are again about benevolent actions. Keep in the back of your mind there is always a need for blood at this time of year.


