Formed in 1964 by a special Act of the Ontario Legislature to provide the means for using the Craft's financial resources for the benefit of the community at large. It is a public Foundation and is registered with the Canada Customs and Revenue Agency.

The objectives of the Foundation clearly set out its charitable nature:

- to receive, maintain, manage, control and use donations exclusively for charitable purposes within the Province of Ontario
- to use its donations for the relief of poverty, the advancement of education and the advancement of other purposes beneficial to the community; and For the Cause of Good

The good works of the Masonic Foundation of Ontario are laid out each year in their Annual Report. Their Annual Meeting is held in Toronto during the week of Grand Lodge's Annual Communication. The Masonic Foundation support meaningful funding for Prostate Cancer Research three highly respected research projects which provide

A federally incorporated charitable corporation, with its own Board of Directors, held its inaugural meeting in Woodstock on January 7, 2012. I am proud say I was a Founding Director.

The MasoniCh.I.P. (Child ID Program) consists of five major components: vital child information; digital fingerprints; digital photographs; a digital video and a dental bite impression. All of this data, except the dental component, is burned onto a CD.

It only takes a few minutes from the time the CD-Rom is loaded into the Police computer for the AMBER ALERT broadcast to be sent throughout their system. All this material and information is given to the parent or guardian.

No information is ever stored by the MasoniChIP program.

Although only four years has passed since the Foundation was formed they must now upgrade their computer which presents a significant outlay of funds.
